## **Jurisdictional Information:**

Each year the council recommends to the President of the University a list of individuals for the role of COSS chair. The President recommends one person for the position of COSS chair to the University Affairs Board for approval.

# Highlights:

At the February 1st 2001 meeting of COSS, a sub-committee of COSS was established to review the current practice for the appointment of the COSS chair. The committee was directed to outline principles and guidelines for a fair and equitable process for the selection of a COSS chair. This committee would make recommendations to COSS by the March 15<sup>th</sup> meeting.

# **Action Sought:**

BIRT COSS approve the recommended Nomination process for the position of Chair for the Council on Student Services (COSS) as an amendment to Appendix A of the COSS protocol.

5. Nomination process for the position of Chair for the Council on Student Services (COSS)

#### A. PRINCIPLES:

- 1. The Chair of COSS must be a student.
- 2. The position of Chair will be rotated across the student constituencies (full-time undergraduate, part-time undergraduate, graduate) according to the following process so that within a three year period each student government will have one opportunity to nominate up to 3 people from their constituency for the position of COSS Chair.
- 3. The order of rotation will be: GSU, APUS, SAC.
- 4. If a student government is unable to submit up to 3 nominees, the responsibility will go to the next designated student government, until up to 3 nominations are submitted. The originally designated student government would be first in the order of rotation to nominate 3 students in the following year.
- 5. Conflicts of interest should be declared in advance by the nominee in accordance with the practice of the university.

# **B. CHARACTERISTICS/QUALIFICATIONS FOR COSS CHAIR:**

- \* Demonstrated familiarity with the University governance structure
- \* Experience chairing using formalized rules of procedure
- \* Familiarity with University Student Services covered by the COSS protocol

## C. NOMINATIONS PROCESS:

- 1. All members of COSS will be invited by the designated student government to submit suggested names to the designated student government.
- 2. The designated student government will consider the suggestions and submit up to 3 nominees from their constituency to COSS at least 2 weeks before the final meeting of COSS.
- 3. The nominations will be approved at the final meeting of COSS
- 4. One recommendation will be forwarded to the President of the University.
