KEY ACCOMPLISHMENTS



Increased attendance at ASD programming by 50% and introduced two new ASD programs within Accessibility Services.



Created two navigation-based resources for students.



Established connection with 12 external networks including other post-secondary institutions.



Supported Accessibility Advisors during the intake process with the rapidly growing number of newly registered autistic students.



Provided essential one-to-one support to hundreds of students on the Autism spectrum.



Led workshops with six campus partners on how to better support Autistic students.
