Supports student groups with financial donations. Please write a letter with details about your event and budgeting requests.

Deadline: Each semester

[Campus Initiatives](#)

Designed to support up-and-coming student groups in building their communities and their ability to make an impact. Reserved for newly-established student groups seeking to lead specific community impact projects.

Amount: up to \$1000

[Equity Ideas Fund](#)

Student groups can apply for up to \$500 in funding for initiatives related to equity, diversity, inclusion, and belonging, and physical activity, which are then considered within the scope and parameters of the Faculty's Equity Ideas Fund approval process.

Who can apply: All U of T student groups

Amount: Up to \$500

Deadline: Rolling basis, a period of at least three weeks prior to the event date is recommended

[Good Ideas Fund | Hart House](#)

Provides funding for initiatives, events, projects and ideas that draw attention to an issue or build community. Proposals must fall into one of three priority categories: Arts and Culture, Dialogue Initiatives or Wellness.

Who can apply: All current University of Toronto undergraduate and graduate students, including Transitional Year Programme and Woodsworth Bridging Program students – individuals or recognized student groups.

Amount: up to \$1000

Deadline: Specific dates per semester (reference the website)

Heart Works Student Group Initiative Fund

Support for student group initiatives that aspire to create opportunities for critical and respectful exploration of questions of religious and spiritual pluralism.

Amount: The Heart Works Fund will award a maximum of \$1500 for each successful project, pending availability of funds.

Application Deadline: Once per academic year

Student Initiative Fund & Black Student Engagement Fund

Offers financial reimbursement to projects that enhance the student experience and foster a sense of community

Amount: up to \$3000

Who can apply: All U of T students or student groups from the St. George campus

Deadline for SIF: Specific dates per semester (reference the website)

Deadline for BSEF: on a rolling basis

University of Toronto Student Union Clubs Funding

Funding is allocated by the Clubs Committee on the recommendation of the Vice-President, Student Life in accordance with the criteria outlined in the Clubs Policy. Please ensure that you have completed steps 1-4 for club registration before applying for funding, you may experience a serious delay in receiving funding otherwise.

Deadline: 15th March, 11:59pm

University of Toronto Graduate Student's Union Donations Request

All UTGSU Members are eligible to submit requests for monetary donations from the UTGSU towards events and/or initiatives which enhance the University of Toronto graduate student experience.

Who can apply: Members of UTGSU (not organized by any of the following: Course unions or affiliate course unions, UTGSU Levy Groups, UTGSU Committees, UTGSU Caucuses)

Application Deadline: Minimum of two weeks prior to the event

College-Specific Funds

Most colleges offer grants for student initiatives. A few examples are listed below. Check with your college registrar about funds for your idea.

[Victoria College Dean's Experience Enhancement Fund](#)

This fund helps Victoria students pursue important out-of-the-classroom experiences that may or may not be related to their coursework or academic programs.

Amount: Up to \$250

Deadline: February 1

[New College Initiative Fund \(NCIF\)](#)

The New College Initiative Fund (NCIF) was established to support initiatives related to the New College community and its academic programs. Expenditures from the fund may include—but are not limited to—off-setting costs for events and/or other initiatives that enhance the student experience, link research to undergraduate teaching, encourage interdisciplinary community outreach, enhance accessibility, and advance equity and diversity.

Amount: up to \$5000

Deadline: At least 8 weeks prior to the initiative

[UTERN \(University of Toronto Environmental Resource Network\) Funding](#)

One of the primary goals of UTERN is to allocate funding to individuals or environmental groups planning projects or events related to sustainability.

Amount: Up to \$5000

Department-Specific Funds

Some departments offer grants for student initiatives. A few examples are listed below. Check with your department about funds for your idea.

[Latin American Studies Engagement Award](#)

Open to all undergraduate students in the Faculty of Arts & Science, graduate students enrolled in the School of Graduate Studies, and student groups recognized by ULife. This award provides support for the organization of an event focused on issues related to Latin America or its diasporas, and whose primary audience is undergraduate students at the University of Toronto.

Amount: up to \$500

Deadline: End of January, event should take place before end of April

Community Outreach SPANPORT DPT-

Initiatives to be considered may include lectures, symposia, workshops, film screenings, etc.

If the proposal includes a request for funding, we can provide a maximum of \$250 CAD. Eligible expenses include room rental, catering, event promotion, and travel as per the University of Toronto

Amount: up to \$250

Deadline: Rolling basis
